1) Answer: b) Only two

- Statement 2: Correct. Chief Ministers and Union Territory representatives are part of NITI Aayog.
- Statement 3: Correct. Up to four Union Ministers are exofficio members.
- Statement 1: Incorrect. The Vice-Chairperson is nominated by the Prime Minister, not elected by Parliament.

2) Answer: c) The Great Man-Made River project for water supply

• Libya lacks natural perennial rivers or lakes. The Great Man-Made River is an extensive artificial water supply project crucial for its arid region.

3) Answer: c) Statement-I is correct but Statement-II is incorrect

• H5N1 is zoonotic, capable of jumping from animals to humans. However, human-to-human transmission is rare, preventing widespread outbreaks.
